Indoor

Conservation Tips

Estimated Savings

Run the dishwasher only when full	1-2 Gallons per day
Don't leave water running when rinsing dishes	5-10 gallons per day
Turn off water when brushing your teeth	4 gallons per day
Shorten showers	10 gallons per day
Don't use the toilet as a wastebasket	2 gallons per day
Fix leaky toilets	30-50 gallons per day per toilet
Fix leaky faucets	15-20 gallons per day per leak
Replace older, inefficient clothes washers	20-30 gallons per day
Replace older, high-volume flushing toilets	6-10 gallons per day
Wash only full loads of clothes	15-48 gallons per day
Install aerators with flow restrictions on kitchen/ bathroom faucets	4.7 gallons per day

Outdoor

Conservation Tip

Estimated Savings

Water only in the late evening or early morning hours to reduce evaporation and interference from wind	20-25 gallons per day
Adjust sprinklers to prevent overspray and runoff	15-25 gallons per day
Repair leaks and broken sprinkler heads	50-100 gallons per day
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Reduce each irrigation cycle by 1-3 minutes, or eliminate one irrigation cycle per week. • Water only after the top inch of soil is dry • Adjust irrigation controllers with the seasons and replace batteries in the spring and fall 	100-165 gallons per day
Add 2"-3" of mulch around trees and plants to reduce evaporation. Healthy plants in a moist bed rich in organic material need watering less frequently.	20-25 gallons per day
Install water-efficient drip irrigation systems for trees, shrubs, and flowers to get water to the plants roots more efficiently.	20-25 gallons per day
Replace a portion of lawn with beautiful native and climate appropriate plants.	33-60 gallons per day per 1,000 square feet
Use a broom instead of a hose to clean driveways and sidewalks	8-18 gallons per day
Get a self-closing nozzle for your hose	8-18 gallons per day
Install covers on pool and spas to reduce evaporation	30 gallons per day

NEW WATER CONSERVATION RESTRICTIONS

City of Hollister / Sunnyslope Water Customers

Winter 2016 saw improved hydrologic conditions in parts of California. More rain and snow fell in Northern California as compared to Central and Southern California; yet, due to California's water conveyance systems, concerns over supply reliability have eased even in urban Southern California. Consequently, the mandatory demand-driven conservation standards in place over the last several months have been adjusted. Conservation standards are still needed in case winter 2016 was a short reprieve in a longer drought.

All customers are asked to make every effort to conserve water and abide by the following restrictions. All customers are encouraged to reduce water consumption by 15% **compared to their water use in 2013**. The WRASBC can assist you!

OUTDOOR WATER RESTRICTIONS

- Landscape watering shall be limited and restricted to no more than three (3) days per week. **Odd numbered** addresses are hereby restricted to watering on Tuesdays, Thursdays and Saturdays. **Even numbered** addresses are hereby restricted to watering on Wednesdays, Fridays and Sundays.
- No watering of landscaping between the hours of 9am and 5pm unless it is with drip irrigation or hand watering with a quick acting positive shut off nozzle.
- No washing down sidewalks, driveways, or other hardscape surfaces.
- No watering lawns within 48 hours of rain
- No watering landscape in a manner that causes runoff to adjacent property, non-irrigated areas, private and public walkways, roadways, or parking lots.
- No washing of cars without the use of a quick acting, positive shutoff nozzle.
- No operation of decorative fountains or other water features unless the water is recirculated.

GENERAL

- Leaks, breaks and malfunctions of irrigation systems and plumbing equipment causing waste of water shall be repaired and corrected within a reasonable amount of time as determined by the District Manager of Sunnyslope County Water District or the City Manager of the City of Hollister.
